## Insider Guides Dublin Music & Dance

Dublin has long been regarded as a musical Mecca, which attracts people from all over the world.

There seems to be an innate rhythm in us, inherent from our ancestors from a time of famine and poverty, when all we had was our music. Just stroll along the streets of Dublin, and you'll soon be walking to the melody of the city.

A huge draw to Dublin for people is to experience real Irish traditional music, or as the locals call it; Trad'. You will be enchanted by the diverse musical sounds as you stroll through Temple Bar and Grafton Street as buskers and street performers entertain and enliven the streets. Remember to look twice as regular 'buskers' on Grafton Street can include Rodrigo y Gabriela, Damien Rice, Glen Hansard, Sinead O'Connor and Bono!

Irish traditional music is fast paced and 'toe tappingly' lively incorporating many of Irelands wonderful and unique instruments. With the use of tin whistle's, fiddles, accordions, guitars and Irish circular drums called Bodhráns (pronounced Bow-Rahn) you'll be mesmerized and thrilled by the intricate skill and rhythm of the musicians and dancers. If you want a good old trad session pop into Oliver St. John Gogarty's in Temple Bar, or O'Donoghues Bar on Merrion Row. Venture a little further afield to Johnnie Fox's Pub and not only will you enjoy one of the best trad sessions in Dublin, but you will also have visited the highest pub in Dublin! The Dublin Traditional Irish Music Pub Crawl offers visitors and locals alike the opportunity to get hands on in this musical trek across the city complete with two professional musicians as your hosts. For a truly unique introduction to one of Irelands most sacred of traditions of music and song you won't be disappointed on one of the most memorable nights in Dublin.

Since its first performance in the 1994 Eurovision Song Contest held in Dublin, the world has been captivated by 'Riverdance', an astounding spectacle of Irish music and dance. The show now returns to the **Gaiety Theatre** every summer to entertain audiences. Other enchanting performances of Irish dancing, accompanied by traditional Irish dinner may be enjoyed at the **Arlington Hotels** seven nights a week or at the **Merry Ploughboy Pub**, located south of the city.

Regardless of your musical taste, in Dublin you're definitely spoiled for choice for music venues. Dublin city has one of the highest concentrations of pubs and clubs in the world many of which on a regular basis will be packed to the rafters enjoying some of the many sounds of the city. Favourite spots amongst the locals are the old styled O'Neills on Suffolk St, and Whelan's or The Village where up and coming bands often test their material and their musical merits to enthusiastic audiences! Or why not check out The Session with the Pipers in The Cobblestone Pub in Smithfield for some trad music recitals.

Dublin is home to more than a few musical legends, and our pub scene is indicative of this. Ronnie Drew from the Dubliner's began his career as a regular pub performer. Phil Lynott has been immortalised as his statue stands proudly outside Bruxelles just off Grafton Street, so when you're enjoying a pint, al fresco, you can raise your glass to Phil! U2 have a very special relationship with Dublin city, as the band has been as good to the city, as Dubliners have been to U2. We are as proud of them as we would be our brother, nephew, father or friend, and the city's heart beats just a little louder when they come home to perform! The original Windmill Lane Studios or 'U2 studios' as they are often known, have long since relocated but the original studios, although derelict, are still a popular cult symbol for U2 fans to visit.

The Irish culture is greatly influenced by our love of all things musical whether its dance or song. Every year, Dublin becomes the pinnacle hot spot for the musical festival circuit bringing in some of the best talent in the country and even Europe. Dublin City Soul Festival, Dublin Dance Festival, DLR Festival of World Culture, The Waltons Guitar Festival and Temple Bar Tradfest are just to name a few.

Dublin is a prime European city for concerts, most of which are held in the newly refurbished 02 arena. A large variety of well-known international singers and bands perform here on a regular basis. As well as pop and rock concerts, Dublin has two of its own opera festivals, the **DLR Glasthule Opera Festival** held in the Pavilion Theatre every June and the **Anna Livia Opera Festival** held in the Gaiety Theatre every September. For lovers of classical music, the **National Concert Hall** stages enchanting performances every evening.

So whatever type of musical genre you want to sample, Dublin is sure not to disappoint. So make sure you pack your dancing shoes, and be ready to engulf yourself in the music that the streets inspire and the people evoke.
